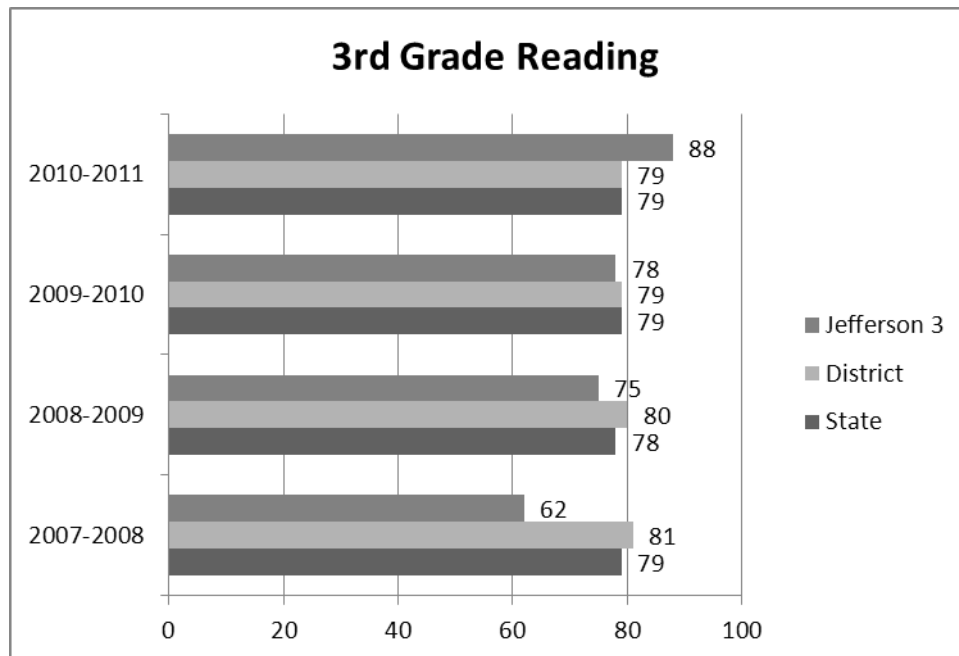

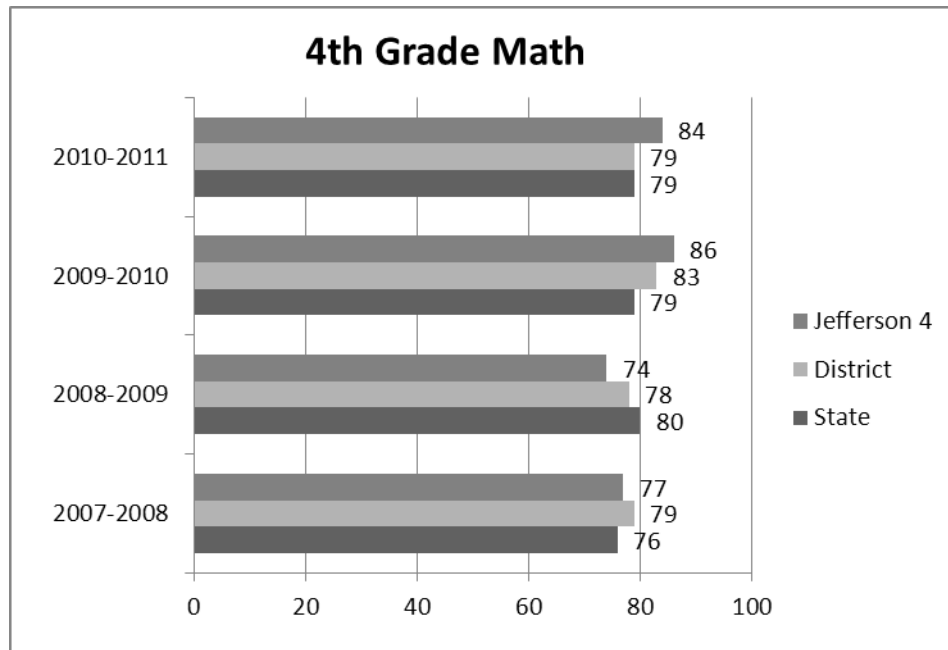

Summary comments: The 4th grade team continues to implement the Math Expressions curriculum for their students. As you can see we started it a couple of years ago and based upon the increase in test scores it must really be working. Teachers receive yearly staff developments in math either at school or during summer math institutes
