## High School Summer School Credit Recovery Course Descriptions

All credit courses will be graded using the AASD Policy for High School Grading

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COURSE:	<b>1000 English Language Arts 9</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
PREREQUISITES:	Must be credit deficient in English Language Arts 9. Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
CONTENT:	English Language Arts 9 integrates reading, writing, speaking and listening, and language. The major focus is learning to comprehend text through a variety of reading skills and strategies. Students apply these skills and strategies in a variety of quality literature and informational text. The writing process and six-trait writing provide the foundation for writing instruction. The focus is based on the concept of the individual as well as interpersonal relationships. The goal of the selected text and activities is to provide students with experiences that will enable them to understand self-esteem, self-awareness, and personal style.		
FEE:	\$5.00 Materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
COURSE:	<b>1020 English Language Arts 10 Only</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient .5 Credit/semester
PREREQUISITES:	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F". Must have successfully completed ELA 9.		
CONTENT:	English Language Arts 10 integrates reading, writing, speaking and listening, and language. The major focus is learning to comprehend text through a variety of reading skills and strategies. Students apply these skills and strategies in a variety of quality literature and informational text. The writing process and six-trait writing provide the foundation for writing instruction. Formal speaking is an emphasis. The focus is based on improving societal awareness. Selected text and activities will enhance students' understanding of themes that permeate all societies, such as gender issues, generational conflicts, family structures, environment, government, and racism. Themes will focus on individuals and their relationships to society (community, region, country) and the world.		
FEE:	\$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
COURSE:	<b>1110 American Literature &amp; Composition</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
PREREQUISITES:	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
CONTENT:	American Literature and Composition is a survey of American Literature. The course integrates reading, writing, speaking and listening, and language. The major focus is learning to comprehend text through a variety of reading skills and strategies. Students apply these skills and strategies in a variety of quality literature and informational text. The writing process and six-trait writing provide the foundation for writing instruction.		
FEE:	\$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		

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**COURSE:** **1250 Senior Communication** Offered S1 & S2 Credit Deficient Only  
.5 Credit/semester

**PREREQUISITES:** Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".

**CONTENT:** Senior Communications will prepare students for the transition to the work place and adulthood. Students will identify, gather, and apply resources; demonstrate the ability to work with others; and apply appropriate technology. Projects will combine strands of reading/literature, writing, and oral communication. Students will explore careers through job shadows. They will develop portfolios that demonstrate competencies necessary for employment and/or continued education, which will assist them in entering post-high school experiences.

**FEE:** \$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.

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**COURSE:** **0010 Physical Education** Offered S1 & S2 Credit Deficient Only  
.5 Credit/semester

**PREREQUISITES:** Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".

**CONTENT:** Course includes: **Cooperative Games** – the practice of fundamentals for the improvement of individual skills, rules, offensive and defensive team play and game strategies – focus is working cooperatively in groups. **Instructional Swimming** covers the techniques of fundamental stroke development in accordance with the individual's skill level. **Dance** students learn ballroom dancing that includes basic dance positions, steps, and etiquette. Exposure to other types of dance will be provided.

**FEE:** \$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.

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**COURSE:** **4990 Health Education** Offered S1 & S2 Credit Deficient Only  
.5 Credit/semester

**PREREQUISITES:** Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".

**CONTENT:** This course will cover the required areas of health with the emphasis on applying knowledge and values to affect health related behaviors. Topics covered will be personal health, nutrition, mental and emotional health, prevention and control of disease, substance use and abuse, community and environmental health, accident prevention and safety, consumer health and family life education.

**FEE:** \$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.

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**COURSE:** **3000 Civics** Offered S1 & S2 Credit Deficient Only  
.5 Credit/semester

**PREREQUISITES:** Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".

**CONTENT:** This course allows the student to investigate and explore the workings of our democratic society. The content will include the structure of government, the electoral process and personal economics. Students also will analyze historical documents, examine the influence of media, economics and group process in a democratic society, interpret current events, explore the value of diversity in U.S. society and explore individual rights and responsibilities of U.S. citizenship. The course includes study skills, research techniques, data interpretation, and problem solving and communication skills.

**FEE:** \$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.

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COURSE:	<b>3070 U.S. History</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
PREREQUISITES:	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
CONTENT:	A study of democracy and its origins is necessary for an adequate understanding of the responsibilities of the American adult. Past events are used to assist them in arriving at conclusions regarding contemporary issues.		
FEE:	\$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
COURSE:	<b>3520 Global Studies</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
PREREQUISITES:	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F". (This course does meet the sophomore Global Studies requirement, but does not meet the requirements of U.S. History.)		
CONTENT:	Contemporary World Studies Students will explore the physical, historical, economic, demographic, and political aspects of our contemporary world. The emphasis for this course will be placed on cultural geography and how cultural issues are reshaping our world.. Students will develop a thorough understanding of the issues in the world today and will investigate and analyze world news events as they occur.		
FEE:	\$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
COURSE:	<b>4000 Physical &amp; Earth Science</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
PREREQUISITES:	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
CONTENT:	Physical Science is the study of matter and energy. Students who take this course will work with the everyday applications of physical laws. As students progress through the course, they will realize that the technological advances they take for granted are merely applications of basic physical science principles. Major topics covered in the course will be the properties of matter, light, sound, heat, motion, force, work, and electricity. The course is designed for those students who find it necessary to meet a deficiency in the sciences.		
FEE:	\$10.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
COURSE:	<b>4100 Life Science</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
PREREQUISITES:	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
CONTENT:	This practical, hands-on general biology course uses a variety of activities and laboratory experiences to develop scientific problem-solving skills. The course focuses on scientific thinking, cell biology, evolution, human body systems, application of technology and humans' environmental impact. The course emphasizes various methods that build communication and study skills.		
FEE:	\$10.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
COURSE:	<b>4340 Environmental Science</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
PREREQUISITES:	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
CONTENT:	This laboratory science course will provide students the knowledge and skills needed to analyze and evaluate major environmental issues facing human society. Students gain an understanding of ecology, population biology and natural resources. Integrating biology, chemistry and earth science, students investigate the complex interrelationships of our natural world.		
FEE:	\$10.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		

<b>COURSE:</b>	<b>9000A Algebra 1A</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
<b>PREREQUISITES:</b>	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
<b>CONTENT:</b>	This course provides the foundation for the study of higher levels of mathematics. Emphasis is placed on algebraic symbols and properties, mathematical expressions and statements, functions and graphs, and real-world applications.		
<b>FEE:</b>	\$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
<b>COURSE:</b>	<b>9000B Algebra 1B</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
<b>PREREQUISITES:</b>	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
<b>CONTENT:</b>	This course provides the foundation for the study of higher levels of mathematics. Emphasis is placed on algebraic symbols and properties, mathematical expressions and statements, functions and graphs, and real-world applications.		
<b>FEE:</b>	\$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
<b>COURSE:</b>	<b>9100 Algebra</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
<b>PREREQUISITES:</b>	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
<b>CONTENT:</b>	Algebra provides the foundation for the study of higher levels of mathematics. Emphasis is placed on algebraic symbols and properties, mathematical expressions and statements, functions and graphs, and real-world applications.		
<b>FEE:</b>	\$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
<b>COURSE:</b>	<b>9200 Geometry</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
<b>PREREQUISITES:</b>	Algebra – Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
<b>CONTENT:</b>	Geometry is the exploration and investigation of various geometric shapes and their properties. Students use geometric models to solve real-world problems. An emphasis is placed on presenting convincing arguments by a variety of logical means.		
<b>FEE:</b>	\$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
<b>COURSE:</b>	<b>9240 Math Topics</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
<b>PREREQUISITES:</b>	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
<b>CONTENT:</b>	This course provides a survey of relevant math topics. Realistic problems will be solved using mathematical modeling, the selection of appropriate tools, and mathematical perseverance. Problems are approached arithmetically, investigated geometrically with graphic representation, and represented by the writing and solving of equations.		
<b>FEE:</b>	\$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
<b>COURSE:</b>	<b>9260 Algebra 2</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 Credit/semester
<b>PREREQUISITES:</b>	Student may enroll in this course if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
<b>CONTENT:</b>	In this course, students will revisit key concepts from Algebra, Geometry, and other mathematics courses, building upon students' prior knowledge to develop more advanced understanding of algebraic relationships. Emphasis will be placed upon multiple representations of functions and application of those functions in a variety of situations.		
<b>FEE:</b>	\$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		

COURSE:	<b>6300 Personal Financial Management</b>	Offered S1 & S2	Credit Deficient Only .5 credit/semester
PREREQUISITES:	Open to students in Grades 11 & 12 ONLY if he/she has previously taken the course and received either a "D" or "F".		
CONTENT:	Develops an understanding of money management techniques, finances, risks and diversity of investments, and educates students to become better consumers and achieve personal lifestyle objectives.		
FEE:	\$5.00 materials fee per semester payable the first day of class.		
COURSE:	<b>Edgenuity e2020 Alternative Courses</b>	Credits based on coursework	
PREREQUISITES:	Must be significantly credit deficient in all subject areas, in grade 11-12. Student may enroll in this course if he/she is significantly credit deficient. Teacher recommendation necessary, enrollment is limited.		
CONTENT:	Specific coursework will be determined at registration and will be based on individual student need. Please see counselor for specific registration form.		
FEE:	None.		
COURSE:	<b>6310 Alternative Personal Financial Management</b>	.5 credit/semester	
PREREQUISITES:	Open to students that have taken <u>Alternative</u> PFM and are in Grades 11 & 12 ONLY.		
CONTENT:	Develops an understanding of money management techniques, finances, risks and diversity of investments, and educates students to become better consumers and achieve personal lifestyle objectives. Class held at Central High School.		
FEE:	None.		
COURSE:	<b>9701 Employment Development Course</b>	.5 credit/semester	
PREREQUISITES:	Must be significantly credit deficient. Teacher recommendation necessary.		
CONTENT:	Facilitates career exploration and development by teaching skills needed to become a valuable employee in a fulfilling career choice. Students will learn about career selection, outlook, and application process and skills utilizing the classroom and class trips. Enrollment is limited. Class held at Central High School.		
FEE:	None.		
COURSE:	<b>0791A and 0791B Mathematics</b>	.5 credits/semester	
PREREQUISITES:	Must be significantly credit deficient. Grades 11-12+ only. Teacher recommendation necessary.		
CONTENT:	Summer School Math is intended to provide students with the big rock concepts of algebra and geometry as well as prepare them with skills they will need for math at the technical college level. Upon entrance into the class, students will have their math course history checked and will be given skills assessments by the math teacher to best decide what material each student should complete over the course of the session. Students will use the district adopted textbooks as well as online software to complete this course and build skills needed to develop the eight mathematical practices laid out by the Common Core State Standards. Records will be kept for student progress to be shared with the student's math teacher in the fall. Enrollment is limited. Class held at Central High School.		
FEE:	None		

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## High School Summer Course Descriptions For Credit Courses

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**COURSE:** 1670 Summer Shakespeare Theatre- Runs 30 days, 1:00-4:00pm M-F at North High  
\*\*\*Required to take S1 & S2 and participate in performances at end of course.  
\*\*\*Can be taken for credit one time – then it becomes enrichment.

**PREREQUISITES:** None. Open to any public or private school student grades 9 – 12.

**CONTENT:** Students in this course will learn about Shakespeare, his times, and theatre of English Renaissance by preparing and presenting one of his plays for public performance. Students will also gain knowledge and experience in a variety of theatre skills such as scenic design, costumes, set construction, lighting, publicity, and direction. There are no auditions required. Class sessions/rehearsals and performances will be held at North High School. There will be performances scheduled the weekend after the class concludes.

**FEE:** \$20 total (equals \$10 per semester) materials fee payable the first day of class.

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**COURSE:** **Mile of Music Student Marketing Team** .5 Credit/summer

**PREREQUISITES:** Completion of Student Internship Agreement and Student/Parent Orientation

**CONTENT:** Students will work with the Willems Marketing team to assist in promoting the Mile of Music Festival using various mediums of marketing including – social media, print, radio and TV. The outcome will be to bring an additional 100,000 people to Downtown Appleton throughout the Festival in order to provide an economic boost to local businesses in the Downtown district. Enrollment is limited.

**FEE:** None

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**COURSE:** **Student Marketing Team Midweek Farm Market Internship** .5 Credit/summer

**PREREQUISITES:** Completion of Student Registration Form

**CONTENT:** Students will work with the Appleton Downtown Inc. staff to assist in all areas of promotion and event operations to support the Midweek Farm Market. We will look to the Student Marketing Team to utilize a variety of marketing outlets to promote the Wednesday market and Electronics Benefit Transfer service.

**FEE:** None

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**COURSE:** **AH202 ELL Academic Skills** Fall Grades 9 – 12  
.5 CA credits per session

**PREREQUISITES:** These course options are available to Level 1 or low Level 2 students. It is open to students entering grades 9-12 in the fall.

**CONTENT:** ELL students in this class will continue to develop their oral language, vocabulary and literacy skills by engaging in a variety of high-interest texts. - **All Appleton Area School District policies in place during the regular school year are in effect during Summer School.** Failure to follow the rules and policies of the Appleton Area School District will result in dismissal from the summer school program.
- **The Appleton Summer School Program has a NO ABSENCE, NO TARDY POLICY.** All appointments must be scheduled for non-school hours, including court appointments. Each summer school day represents approximately 7 school-year periods of the class being taken.
- **All fees are to be paid the first day of class. Payments are non-refundable.** Checks are payable to the Appleton Area School District. Students with fee waivers are exempt from summer school fees. Students who qualify for the free milk or the free or reduced lunch program also can have the program and materials fees waived.
