Resources that address course objectives:

Published and public domain choral music will be the primary content of choral music classes 9-12. Most performance indicators and assessments will be identified through the rehearsal-study and performance of this ever-changing repertoire. Specific rubrics are available on the Wisconsin School Music Association website and are included as an appendix to this curriculum. Instructors and adjudicators are at liberty to create and use alternate rubrics as long as they address the performance indicators.

Appleton East, North and West High Schools are members of the Wisconsin School Music Association.

The Wisconsin School Music Association requires professional adjudication of choral programs on a biennial basis. The 9-12 curriculum of the Appleton Area School District recommends professional adjudication through large group festival or a localized clinic/workshop with EACH ensemble on an annual basis. Repertoire standards are partially set by the WSMA with a minimum of one required selection from the large group festival list to be performed at each adjudication or workshop.

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
