Course Description

Exploratory Music is a class where the musical heart, mind and body of the middle level student is engaged through developmentally appropriate experiences involving playing instruments, listening, discussing, reading, history, technology, and more. The overall focus is to build students' music skills and knowledge through experiential musical activities; to encourage the students to be creative and innovative in their musical pursuits; to articulate through words, composition and performance; to help students to connect deeply with music, and to identify aspects of music across time and culture.

Exploratory Music offers opportunities for students to demonstrate their music knowledge and skills through the artistic processes of: Create, Perform, Respond and Connect.
