Course Descriptions

*****When looking at grade level, use grade entering in fall.**

Art Studio

\$10.00

During this four week course, students will participate in an advanced art making environment that will help fine tune their visual art skills. Studio time will be spent diving deep into a variety of art avenues including drawing, painting and sculpture while enhancing problem solving and creative thinking skills.

Cooking

\$15.00

Learn the basics of cooking and baking while discovering some simple healthy substitutions. Come see what new dishes we will be preparing this year! Any of these delicious foods will be great to bring to a gathering of family or friends! Recipes will be distributed during the last week of class so students can recreate their favorite dishes at home. Curriculum may deviate from the standards of AASD nutrition policy. Healthy foods will be prepared when possible.

Digital Explorations

\$5.00

Students will explore digital image editing, digital movie tools, website development and even some of the fundamentals of programming and network gaming. The focus of this course is developing technology literacy through experimentation while having fun and being creative. Students may also expand their editing skills and programming knowledge to create web pages, movies, and interactive 3-D environments.

Digital Photography

\$5.00

Students will explore the world of digital photography and learn techniques for taking good pictures. Students will also learn digital editing and some creative ways to use their photographs. Access to digital camera preferred but not required.

English Language Arts

\$5.00

Ever want to be someone else? Ever want to explore new worlds? Ever want to try something you never thought possible? This summer, through high-interest teen literature, you'll have an adventure of a lifetime alongside your peers! This adventure will also help you dig deeper into yourself through the art of writing. Throughout the process you will unknowingly become the reader and writer you've always thought you could be. Come along for the ride!

Experimental Concoctions

\$15.00

Do you enjoy science experiments? Then this is the class for you! We will explore the ideas and concepts of science through many different activities and experiments, including making our own silly putty and bouncy balls to fantastic marshmallow shooters. We will create many different chemical reactions, explore different scientific ideas through projects, and begin to understand the science involved in so many common situations and objects we see every day.

Flag Football

\$5.00

Flag Football is a great opportunity to learn, play, and improve your skills of throwing, catching, and running without being tackled. Flag Football is a variant American Football in which the basic rules are similar to those of the main stream game. Flag Football is played with two equal teams each trying to pass and run with the ball after the catch over the opposite goal line. The defense tries to stop the offense by grabbing the flag on the player with the ball. The offense has four chances (downs) to make it to the next cone or goal line, whichever comes first. Defensive players are the referees. Sign up & to enjoy the FUN!

Gym & Outdoor Games

\$15.00

Students will work individually and in teams to solve a challenge using a "junk box" filled with everyday items. **Example:** Use the following items to launch a marshmallow peep the farthest distance: string, mouse trap, rubber bands, popsicle sticks, paper plates, plastic spoons, and tape. Time will be allotted for planning, research, construction, and testing.

Math Review and Reinforcement

\$5.00

For students who need assistance and practice with the math concepts from the prior year. Small group and individual instruction will include hands-on practice, math games, and problem solving strategies.

Pay it Forward!

\$10.00

Students will work collaboratively to research, develop, and deliver a "Pay it Forward" project for the school or the local community. With the teacher as the facilitator, students will use organizational and decision making skills to choose a cause, and develop a plan to carry out a "Pay it Forward" project. Examples include but are not limited to: a food drive, adopting the school grounds, work with Woodshop to build and paint a bench for the park, etc.

Road Warriors Bicycle Club

\$5.00

Come join the Road Warriors as we bike the trails of the Fox Valley! Through this summer school course we will learn bicycle repair and maintenance, bicycle safety, and what it is like to be a part of a group bicycle adventure. Our journey will begin and end right here at James Madison, with the occasional "sweet treat" somewhere in-between! Come out and experience the joys of summer - what a great way to have fun while exercising! Bike and Helmet required.

STEMania Workshop

\$10.00

Solar Vehicles! Bridges! Hovercrafts and more! Are you creative and like to design and build? If this describes you, come to join this workshop as we design, build and test out various structures and machines. This is a great way to put into practice your math, science and technology skills at all levels.

Study Skills for Middle School**\$5.00**

This class is designed for incoming seventh graders to introduce the students to the middle school environment and allow them to gain an understanding of the study skills that are necessary to be successful at the middle school level. Topics will include but not limited to: getting to know middle school and what resources will help students succeed in their classes, organization skills, general study skills, and test taking strategies. Skills will be taught through lecture and videos, while being reinforced through discussion, activities, and games.
